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






## **Incentive and Endowment**

#### Performance Based Incentive Standards (PBIS)

In order to track progress and objectively evalute local Smart Start Partnerships based on outcomes and results, a performancebased incentive system was created. Smart Start Partnerships are the communitylevel leaders in establishing a comprehensive early education system where every child has the services they need to enter school ready to succeed. More than 20 criteria have been established in four key areas administration, early care and education, health, and family support. There standards focus the work and resources of Smart Start partnerships in targeted ways that truly make a difference in areas that are proven to impact a child's readiness for Kindergarten. Our Partnership has met high performing standards in all criteria with the exception of one where minimum was met.

#### Margaret Blount Harvey Endowment

In May of 2002, the Partnership Board approved the establishment of an educational endowment at Lenoir Community College in honor of Margaret Harvey. Mrs. Harvey was instrumental in the formation of the Partnership for Children of Lenoir and Greene Counties, as well as providing guidance and leadership during the early years of the Partnership. The endowment provides a scholarship for a student who plans to pursue an Associate's Degree in Early Childhood Education.

### Child Care Quality and Resources

#### Professional Development

- 48 professional development workshops were presented
- **Consultation Services (CS)**

#### Dedication and Education Bonus

 DEB awarded a bonus to 10 child care professionals. Note: This activity will not be funded in 2013-14. DEB participants will be eligible to enroll in a program called WAGE\$, that received Race to the Top Early Learning Challenge grant funds for two years.

#### Preschool and Quality Child Care to Support Literacy

- The Quality Child Care to Support Literacy program (Lenoir County) served 24 children through funding provided by the Partnership.
- The Preschool to Support Literacy program (Greene County) served 20 children through funding provided by the Partnership.

#### NC Pre-Kindergarten Program (NC Pre-K)

NC Pre-K served 278 children.

#### Child Care Health Consultation (CCHC)

The CCHC served 1,137 children in 45 child care centers

Three School served 69 children

#### Community Outreach
