#### **About Lenoir-Greene Partnership for Children**

In 1993, the North Carolina governor Jim Hunt proposed a state-wide, early childhood initiative called Smart Start which would use state funds to provide services for early childhood development. The legislation was ratified and "Partnerships for Children" were established to serve all 100 North Carolina Counties by managing and distributing Smart Start funds to local early childhood initiatives.

The Partnership for Children of Lenoir and Greene Counties, established in 1994, is one of those partnerships and works to develop today's children to become tomorrow's leaders. The Partnership accomplishes this mission by providing and supporting a variety of programs and services that target children and their families.

#### **EC Profile and Endowment**

The Community Early Childhood Profile (EC Profile) provides an annual snapshot of the status of our young children. It includes indicators of child well-being for which local Smart Start Partnerships are held accountable. The EC Profile assesses progress towards realizing Smart Start's mission of advancing a high quality, comprehensive, accountable early childhood system that benefits each child in North Carolina beginning with a healthy birth. The report uses validated data from state agencies that directly impact young children such as the NC Department of Health and Human Services, the NC Department of Public Instruction, and the NC Office of State Budget and Management.

#### **Partnership Programs and Services**

#### **Child Care Quality and Resources (CCQR)**

#### This program is a service that consists of:

Professional Development Workshops for child care providers, parents and other interested community members. The Partnership provides Division of Child Development and Early Education (DCDEE) approved professional development workshop opportunities on a regular basis to help child care providers meet DCDEE requirements. Opportunities include but are not limited to Basic School Age Care (BSAC), Playground Safety and Infant/Toddler Safe Sleep and SIDS Risk Reduction in Child Care (ITS-SIDS).

**Technical Assistance (TA)** The focus of technical assistance (TA) is to benefit children, families and the overall child care environment with quality early care and education experiences. The Partnership provides quality technical assistance, based on the Partnership for Inclusion (PFI) model of consultation, at no charge to any licensed or unlicensed child care provider in Lenoir or Greene County regardless of race, color, ethnicity, religion, age, national origin, gender or disability.

Resource Center for child care professionals, parents and any other community member interested in accessing teacher resources. The Resource Center is a resource library that offers a variety of teacher resources including bulletin board paper and die-cut machines.

#### **Lenoir County Story Walk**

Lenoir County StoryWalk is a fun and educational way to combine literacy, family engagement, and physical activity in the form of a children's storybook along the walking path at Pearson Park in Kinston, NC. StoryWalk® helps to build children's interest in reading while encouraging healthy activity for both adults and children. At StoryWalk, you have an opportunity to join family and friends, have lots of fun, create memories, play and learn outdoors! Also, preschoolers can better prepare for school and meet literacy milestones by building vocabulary skills through reading and conversation. StoryWalk is truly a great way for families and friends to feel connected to their own community! The walking path at Lenoir County StoryWalk is approximately 0.5 miles round trip and consists of 21 reading stations.

#### **Greene County Story Walk**

Greene County StoryWalk is a fun and educational way to combine literacy, family engagement, and physical activity in the form of a children's storybook around the Greene County Sports Complex in Snow Hill, NC. StoryWalk® helps to build children's interest in reading while encouraging healthy activity for both adults and children. At StoryWalk, you have an opportunity to join family and friends, have lots of fun, create memories, play and learn outdoors! Also, preschoolers can better prepare for school and meet literacy milestones by building vocabulary skills through reading and conversation. StoryWalk is truly a great way for families and friends to feel connected to their own community! The walking path at Greene County StoryWalk consists of 30 reading stations.

#### NC Pre-Kindergarten Program (NC Pre-K)

NC Pre-K (formerly known as More at Four) is a program of the Division of Child Development and Early Education (DCDEE) in North Carolina's Division of Health and Human Services that is designed to provide high-quality educational experiences to enhance school readiness for eligible four-year-olds.

#### **Triple P**

The Triple P – Positive Parenting Program is a parenting and family support system designed to prevent and treat behavioral and emotional problems in children. Triple P gives parents simple and practical strategies to help them confidently manage their children's behavior, prevent problems developing and build strong, healthy relationships.

#### **Three-School Program**

The Three-School program is a high-quality pre-school program designed specifically for three-year-olds. Its purpose is to provide an academic pre-school experience targeting at-risk children who have not been served in any other formal program. The program was modeled after the More at Four Pre-Kindergarten program (now known as NC Pre-K), which has a history of success both locally and state-wide.

Three-School program classrooms are located in a variety of settings and have no more than 16 children each. These classrooms utilize the Creative Curriculum@ and typically follow the same schedule as the local public schools. Lead teachers and teacher assistants meet education standards set by The Partnership for Children of Lenoir and Greene Counties.

#### **Community Outreach**

The Partnership for Children of Lenoir and Greene Counties' Community Outreach Program provides education and materials to families, child care providers, the business community, community-based leaders and the general public on our many programs and services. Participation in community events and marketing campaigns are used to share our mission with our communities.

#### Safe Kids Eastern NC

Safe Kids Eastern Carolina is a North Carolina Safe Kids Coalition serving the counties of Lenoir, Jones and Greene. Safe Kids Eastern Carolina is housed at The Partnership for Children of Lenoir and Greene Counties. Our areas of focus primarily are poison prevention and control, child passenger safety, and bicycle safety.

#### **Parents as Teachers**

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a parent education and family support program serving families throughout pregnancy up until their child enters kindergarten, usually age 5. PAT is provided at no charge.

Parents are supported by PAT-certified parent educators trained to translate scientific information on early brain development into specific when, what, how and why advice for families. By understanding what to expect during each stage of development, parents can easily capture the teachable moments in everyday life to enhance their child's language development, intellectual growth, social development and motor skills.

#### **Child Care Health Consultant (CCHC)**

Child Care Health Consultants (CCHCs) are trained health professionals with education and experience in both child and community health and early care and education. CCHCs work with programs to assess, plan, implement, and evaluate strategies to achieve high quality, safe and healthy child care environments. The Child Care Health Consultant makes site visits to targeted facilities in both Lenoir and Greene Counties year-round prioritizing those with one and two-star licenses, histories of poor compliance with health/safety standards, and/or high percentages of subsidized children.

#### Reach Out and Read (ROR)

Reach Out and Read is a nonprofit organization that trains and supports medical providers who give books to children and advice to parents about the importance of reading aloud at well-child exams.

During regular pediatric check-ups, Reach Out and Read pediatricians, family physicians and nurse practitioners give new, developmentally-appropriate books to children, ages 6 months through 5 years, and advise parents about the importance of reading aloud.

As a result of this evidence-based intervention, parents learn new ways to stimulate their children's literacy development, have more books in their home, and read to their children more. Parents are supported as their children's first and most important teachers, and children grow up to become readers. (www.reachoutandread.org)

#### **Dolly Parton Imagination Library (DPIL)**

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a program that mails a free book each month to children from birth up until the month of their 5th birthday. These are high-quality books that are chosen by experts in the education and writing field and are based on the child's age.

Smart Start and Dolly Parton's Imagination Library are working together to get books into the hands of North Carolina's youngest children. In 2017, North Carolina's state lawmakers included \$3.5 million in the first year and \$7 million in the second year of the state budget for Smart Start to administer Dolly Parton's Imagination Library across North Carolina.

The Smart Start network, made up of 75 local partnerships that serve our state's communities, is signing up families across NC for Imagination Library which is a book gifting program for children from birth to age five. Together, we are working to ensure children develop a love of reading early on.

#### **WAGE\$** (Professional Development Supplements)

The Child Care WAGE\$® Program was created in response to research that showed the quality of care children receive in child care centers or family child care homes is lowered by high teacher turnover rates and inadequate teacher education. However, a lack of resources and efforts to maintain affordability for parents mean many early childhood teachers are severely underpaid and leave the field for better paying jobs. And others never consider the profession as an option. WAGE\$ provides tiered education-based salary supplements to teachers, directors and family child care educators working with children from birth to 5 years old, leading to better educated teachers and greater continuity of care for young children.




